#### **LONG-TIME MEMBER BETTY WOOD DIES**



Betty Wood, beloved wife of the late Woodson T. Wood, passed away at age 93 on November 11, 2023.

Mary Betty Bower was born on July 17, 1930 to Louis Stockton Bower and Julia Wallingford Bower. She grew up in Flemingsburg, Ky and graduated from Fleming County High School. She attended the University of Kentucky before her marriage and later completed her education at Morehead State University, earning a B.A. in Music in 1981.

Betty was married for 62 years to Woodson T. Wood and spent time raising her children before returning to college to complete her education. She taught piano and organ in her home for many years.

She loved her family, her beloved cottage at Park Lake, church, her garden, her home where she lived for 62 years, candy bars, shopping and laughter. She was an excellent cook and a wonderful hostess. Music was a big part of Betty's life. She served the First Presbyterian Church as organist, choir director and choir member, sang in the Limestone Chorale, played piano for the Woodie Wood Big Band, was a member of the Maysville Players and made sure that her

six children took piano lessons. Betty was a past regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution and a member for many years. She was a member of the American Guild of Organists.

In spite of significant medical obstacles during the past four years, Betty had a great spirit and a strong will to enjoy life to the fullest (see "chocolate bars and shopping, above").

#### **ESTABLISHING AN ORGAN MUSIC LIBRARY**


Recently we have had several members donate their organ music to Lexington AGO for distribution among our members. It has been proposed that instead of giving all of the scores to a few people maybe we can set up a library system for organists to borrow scores and return when they are finished. The "library" could also include bins of duplicates and unwanted scores that patrons could pick up and keep permanently.

Potentially, the music could be divided between sacred and non-sacred works, alphabetized by composer for non-sacred works, with collections of several works in one volume in a separate category. If time permits, hymn arrangements could be listed by tune name as well as record compositions by composer's name.

The big issue is space. There are several boxes of organ music stored at Central Christian. Some of our members also have boxes of donated music stored at their homes. It would be good to see the music to be placed in bins instead of cardboard boxes. Filing cabinets could also be used, but would be more expensive.

One of our members who holds a degree in library science is willing to take on the project of sorting and cataloging our donated music if we can figure out the logistics. If you think this is a project you would like to support, think about available storage space in your church. Once the project is completed, we can let AGO people know about the collection.
