A Sketchy History of Hymn Tune Names:

Instead of using ALL CAPS (which, in texting, is apparently associated with SHOUTING!), most hymnals by convention indicate the names of hymn tunes quite elegantly in SMALL CAPS. As a small child, sitting alone in the pews on Sundays (orphaned by parents who did choir), I was fascinated by the HYMN TUNE NAMES in their magical, special font. Here is a very brief history of the naming of hymn tunes.

The practice of giving a *tune* its own name (independent of the name of the hymn) goes back at least as far as the Hebrew Psalmists. Because many different Psalms were sung to the same familiar tune, the tunes were given names (including DO NOT DESTROY, WINE-PRESS, and LILIES) so the Levites would know which melody to sing.

By the 1700s, lots of hymns *not* based on the Psalms were being written. Many of the tunes were named after the first line of the hymns with which they were associated. Some were named for their composers. Richard Redhead (1820-1901) creatively named his tunes Redhead 1, Redhead 2, Redhead 3, and so on. Tunes were also named after churches, Biblical characters, city or street names, even made-up names; many were named for saints. The composer Arthur Sullivan wrote the tune for "Onward Christian Soldiers" in 1871 while at the home of a friend. He named the tune ST GERTRUDE in honor of his hostess.

Secular melodies adapted for use as hymns have often kept their original names (e.g., Greensleeves, Forest Green). Some early American hymn tunes were forthrightly named for the songs from which they were borrowed, such Puella Turbata (The Distressed Damsel), Female Convict, and Captain Kidd.

Our **Members' Recital on October 17** will include works based on hymn tunes appropriate for times scattered across the liturgical year: Herzliebster Jesu, published by Johann Cruger in 1640; St Theodulph, written in 1615 and named after Theodulph of Orleans, Charlemagne's principal theologian; O Filli et Fillæ, the exuberant French tune from the 15th century; Lobe den Herren, first published in 1668; and Adeste Fideles from 1751.
