
This is basically the idea behind the Royal College of Organists' *Play the Organ Year*, "a year-long effort by the whole organ-playing community, not just to increase the number of people learning to play



the organ, but also the number enjoying live and recorded organ music. . . . The best way to achieve both these objectives is to get as many people as possible not just hearing and seeing the instrument, but playing it!

"The organ is a magnificent instrument unlike any other — powerful, versatile, visceral and enormous fun to play. At the heart of *Play the Organ Year* will be an attempt to open this experience to as many people as possible - to encourage them to take a step towards the organ, to lay hands on it wherever possible, and to discover for the first time the unique and thrilling experience of playing this remarkable instrument." AGO has joined with the RCO in promoting this year-long effort. Let's all see what we can do to spread the joy of organ playing!

February 1 & 2: Bach Workshop and Concert with James Kibbie at Christ Church Cathedral, Lexington











FREE ESTEY REED ORGAN TO GOOD HOME!

From Jim Fitzpatrick:

I have a nice reed organ that I would like to re-home. This instrument has one manual (divided keyboard), 8 speaking stops, 16' & 4' couplers, and Tremulant. The left side of the keyboard also has a beautiful sounding Harp Aeoline stop that is exquisite and a loud Vox Jubilante stop (Diapason Celeste) on the right side. One expression pedal and one Crescendo pedal. No pumping is required as this instrument has an on board electric blower.

This instrument was rescued from an Episcopal church in Eastern Kentucky just before it was slated for delivery to the city dump. The organ was completely repaired, cleaned, case refinished, new wiring and new stop knobs installed. There is also a device inside to stabilize temperature and humidity levels.





This instrument would be great in someone's home or in a chapel or church. It has been in my home for the past 20 or so years and now in the way. If interested, contact Jim Fitzpatrick 859-338-9136 phone or text or




